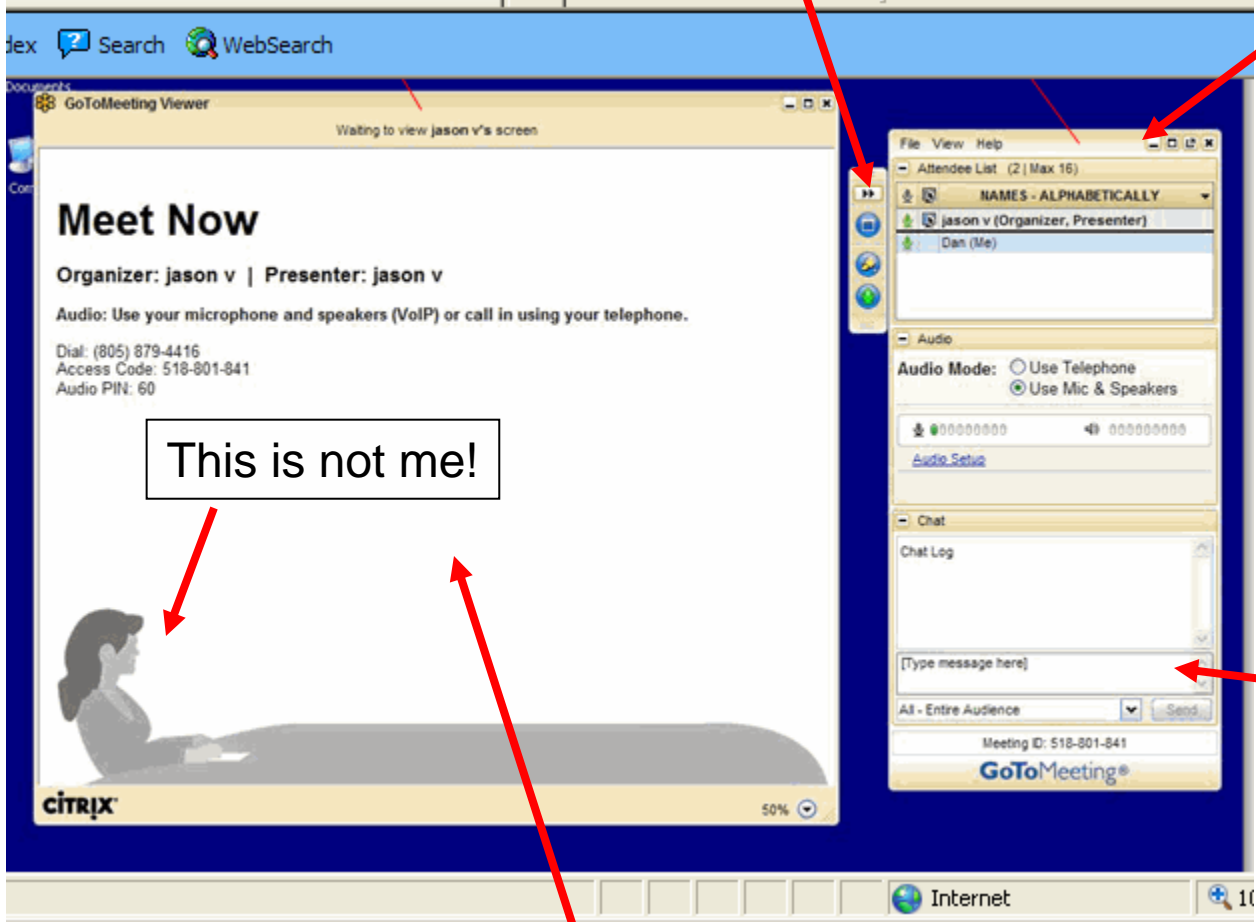

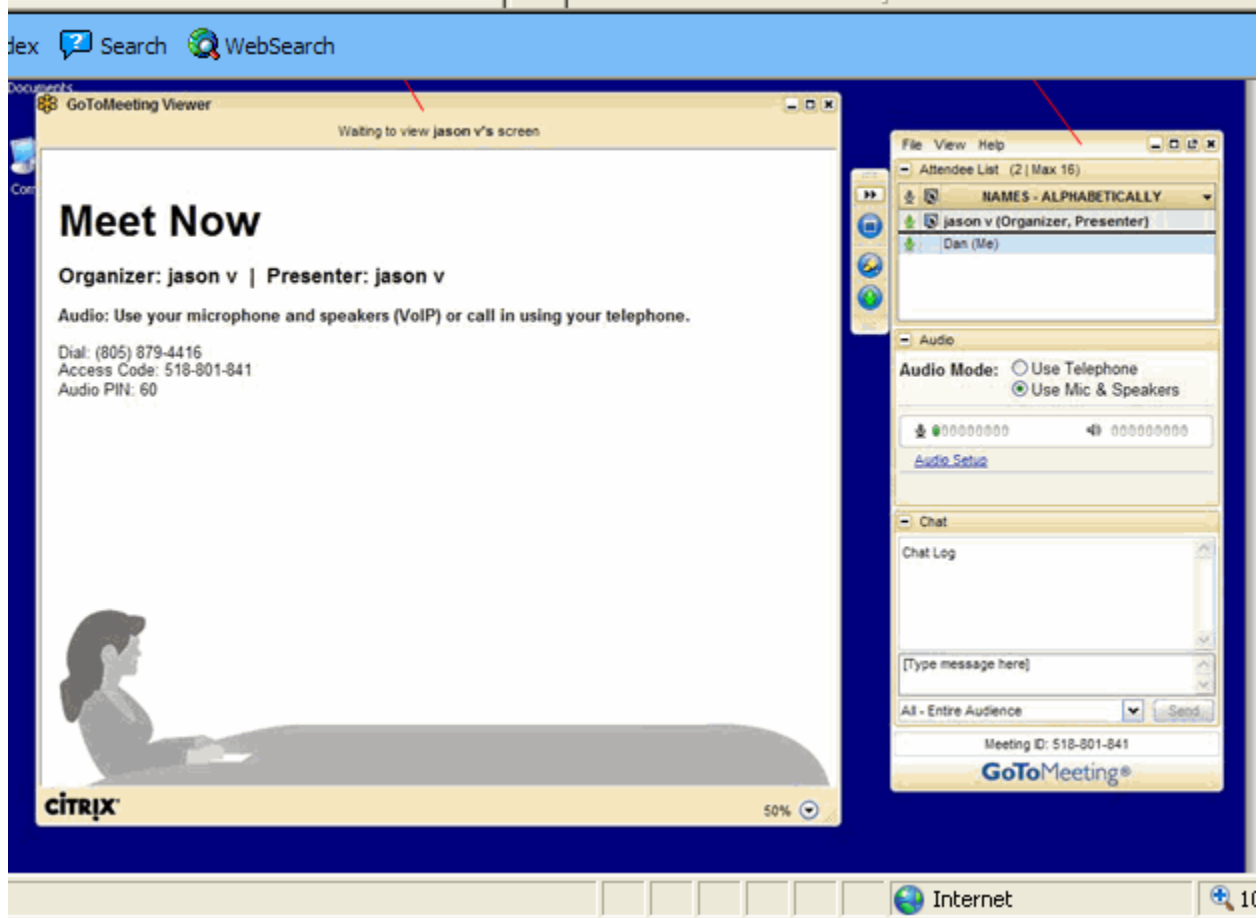
**This is your Control Panel inside GoToMeeting (home of our webinar)**

# FROM ASYNCHRONOUS TO SYNCHRONOUS INTERACTION

- On Saturday, December 13<sup>th</sup> we will be using this screen sharing website to meet for 3 hours to engage in a synchronous interaction.
- We will be using the Cogniscope software ([www.CWALtd.wetpaint.com](http://www.CWALtd.wetpaint.com)) to construct a relational map.
- This will be done live, in real time, with 16 people from 9 different countries!

# Purpose of the Webinar

- The reason why you are here now is to make sure you and your computer will be ready for Dec. 13 synchronous interaction!
- Plus we want to make sure you are comfortable with how to use the asynchronous part of the Webscope Wiki and what to expect to do during the SDD process and what will be the results of the group work.

# About the Wiki

- The word Wiki is new to most of us. It is Hawaiian and means Quick Quick.
- Anyone can use a wiki to create their own website very easily and quickly.
- Wikis are used for collaborating. The point of a wiki is for a group of people to work on a project together.
- Aleco and I have developed a way to use a Wiki for the SDD process. And we call this the Webscope Wiki.



# Why use a Wiki?



# How to use the Wiki

Along the left side of the Wiki is the navigation panel.

This is like a table of contents for the wiki.

Clicking on something in this panel will take you to a page in the wiki.

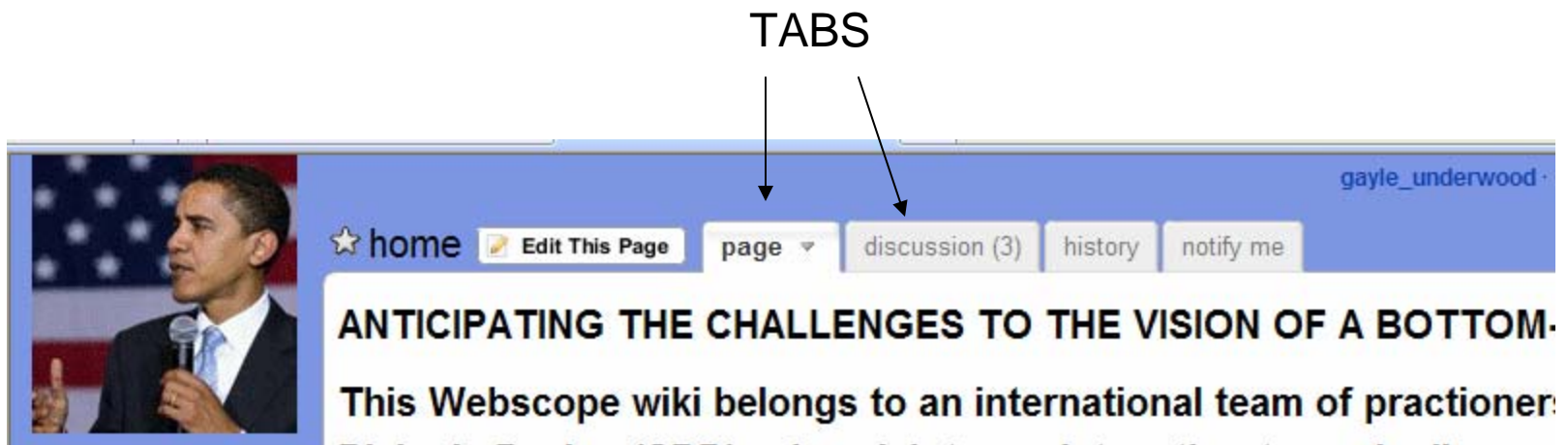

# About the Tabs

Every page of the Wiki has TABS along the top.

The 'edit this page' feature is used to create the page. When you edit, you can add text, video, upload pictures, documents, etc...

You will NOT be editing any pages. You will just be using the discussion tab.




# Discussion Tabs

The Discussion tab brings you to a page that allows you to post messages to the group.

To post a message (start a thread) simply fill out the short form and click on 'Post'

We call it 'starting a thread' because your message starts a conversation between many users.



Click on the subject of a thread to look at a conversation.


# Launching of the Webscope Wiki

- On December 1, you will begin entering your responses to this triggering question

*In the context of Obama's vision for engaging stakeholders from all walks of life in a bottom-up democracy employing Internet technology, what factors do we anticipate, on the basis of our experiences with SDDP, will emerge as inhibitors to the actualization of his vision?*

You will use the “Round 1-Responses to Triggering Question” page to enter your responses.

On the Round 1 page, there is a discussion tab just like in the Lounge.

# Round 2 starts Dec. 4<sup>th</sup>

- Round 2 requires you to read everyone's responses to the triggering question and pose questions for clarification of meaning.
- To make it easier to read everyone's responses the KMT will create a table with everyone's responses, i.e., titles and explanations, and email it to you.
- **You will enter your questions for clarification of meaning on the Wiki.**
- Even though this is round 2, you will be using the Round 1 page to enter your clarification questions, so that your question stays with the statement.

# Rounds 3 and 4

# Helpful Hint:

- Don't "hit and run" on the wiki.
- During Dec 1-13 you need to make it a habit of checking the Wiki.
- Don't just enter a statement and not check back.
- Don't just enter a clarification statement and not check for their response.
- Be an active participant!
- It just takes a minute for you to check things out, it takes us a long time to get your attention to check things out.
