



EUROPE CAN ACT NOW TO SAVE LIVES

Incredibly, to date Europe has only opened the gates to approximately 77,000 Syria's refugees.

This represents just 4% of those who have sought protection from external countries.



HOW LONG HAS EUROPE STOOD BY?

MARCH

The crisis began in March 2011



5,000/DAY

An average of 5,000 now flee the war in Syria every day. Many decide to finally escape after seeing their neighborhoods bombed, or family members killed.

WHERE ARE THEY GOING?


96% of these refugees are hosted by countries in the region such as Jordan, Iraq, Lebanon, Turkey, Egypt and Libya. These countries are experiencing infrastructural and resource challenges of their own and can no longer cope with the increasing numbers of refugees fleeing the Syrian crisis.



WHERE ARE WE NOW?

Three years on, the full-blown civil war has killed over 100,000 people, half of whom are believed to be civilians. Currently 2.4 million registered refugees are on the run from war, with millions more refugees displaced within their own country.

The UN estimates that by the end of 2014, there will be 4 million registered refugees seeking humanitarian assistance.


Sign up to the campaign and a survivor of the Syrian crisis will send their messages directly to your Twitter followers

Their tweets will come from your personal Twitter feed as though these men and women are using your own voice to spread their message




Log on and follow 3 simple steps to give your Twitter feed to a survivor of the Syrian crisis

- 1. Select a Syrian profile to share your Twitter feed
- 2. Choose to give your Twitter feed for a limited time (1 or 7 days)
- 3. Accept the connection







1. SELECT A PROFILE

- Read each profile to learn of their individual struggle
- You can also read what each person has been tweeting about the crisis recently
- Select the profile you wish to share your Twitter feed



2. CHOOSE THE DURATION

- Choose to give your Twitter feed for 1-7 days
- The profile you have selected will send 3-4 tweets from your account each day
- No defamatory, compromising / inappropriate content will be communicated through your account
- You can stop the tweets at any point
- You can sign up again once the time period has ended



3. ACCEPT THE CONNECTION

- When you agree to 'connect' with the campaign, a pop-up window from Twitter will ask you to 'accept'
- If you are already logged in to Twitter, you need only 'accept' and the authorisation is complete, otherwise you will need to log in and then 'accept'
- The authorisation process happens directly via the official, secure Twitter.com site, not the campaign, and so no private information, login data or passwords will be received or stored at any time
- Your privacy will never be compromised


